Our Gospel Meeting got off to a wonderful start with three challenging lessons from the book of Micah. Chapter 6:1-8 proved the basis for the lessons by brother James Rogers. God's challenge to Israel, "What have I done to thee? and wherein have I wearied thee?" (Micah 6:3). Tell me what it is that I have done wrong. What is it that has caused you to no longer follow my instructions? Their worship had become an empty formality. They brought things to sacrifice, but their heart was far from Him. He even makes reference to the pagan practice of offering their children as a sacrifice for their sins. Micah points out that this is not what God wants.

What God wants out of those Micah was addressing and out of us today is found in verse 8. "He hath showed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth he LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" These are not suggestions or recommendations. These are requirements. God wants all of us to do justly, that is justice, to do what is right. He wants us to love mercy. The word has the idea of loving kindness to others. The LORD wants us to walk humbly with Him. Do the right thing. Show Christian attitude toward others all the time. Walk humbly with God. - Are you ever envious of the success of neighboring congregations or fellow preachers? Tear down this wall!
- Do you have prejudice towards people who are different from you in a multiplicity of ways (e.g. race, education, wealth, status, clothing, etc.)? Tear down this wall!

You see, there's still work to be done; There are walls still standing that need to be torn down. While there is a time to build, the wise man said there is also a time to break down (Ecclesiastes 3:3). Accept the challenge, and "tear down this wall!"
