# Returning to Your "First Love" in Marital Distress

The statistics of divorce in our society express that the flames of love in many spouses begin to glimmer and fade. Unfortunately, many spouses do not solve any of their problems, perhaps never dealing with these problems whatsoever. Before one knows it, husbands and wives "fall out of love" just as sure as they "fell in love." To see the warning signs and act properly can save entire families a great deal of pain.

The Bible compares the church as the family or "house of God" (1 Timothy 3:15). Paul describes the proper relationship of husbands and wives in Ephesians 5. Yet, the thrust of his article is to teach "concerning Christ and the church" (Ephesians 5:32). Therefore, one can apply principles of the physical family to the spiritual family, the church. If so, then the reverse can be just as true.

In Revelation 2:1-7, Christ deals with some problems in the family of God worshipping in Ephesus. Their major problem was that they "*left thy first love*" (Revelation 2:4). The three-fold answer from Jesus to return to their first love is in the next verse: remember, repent and repeat. If the church in Ephesus could return to their first love by following this pattern, then why could not husbands and wives in the physical family do the same? Notice each in a little more detail.

For husbands and wives to return to their first love, "[r]emember therefore from whence thou art fallen" (Revelation 2:5). When it seems as if husbands and wives are falling out of love, they need to go back and remember their first time together. They could reminisce about their first date. They should remember the times they shared together in trying to impress one another. All spouses need to make it a practice to watch their wedding video and/or look at their wedding pictures at least once a year, possibly on their anniversary. In addition, spouses ought to remember their vows they made on their wedding day, and remind each other of the commitment each made to the other spouse. Couples that continually remind themselves of the good old days will more than likely continue to live in those same days.

For husbands and wives to return to their first love, "...repent" (Revelation 2:5). Since repentance is an individual action, it does no good to squabble over the faults of others, including your spouse. Before you complain about the mote in your spouse's life, make sure that you repent of the beam protruding from your own (cf. Matthew 7:1-5). Husbands and wives who each look at his or her own life and properly correct the flaws found therein will be able to fall back in love again.

For husbands and wives to return to their first love, "...do the first works." Remember the things you did in the early moments of your marriage (i.e., holding hands when you walk together, opening doors for your wife). Why not wash the dishes together as you once did, instead of one doing the task alone while the other is occupied in another room? Go back and do the things you once did, and do not allow other things, even intricately good things as children and work, to get in the way from spending time together and constantly showing the other your love and care.

If you and your spouse are falling out of love, return to your first love by remembering, repenting and repeating the things you once did early in the marriage.
